#### 5. Chairman's report - Michelle

I am pleased to be able to present to you my chairs report this will be a reflection of the work and successes of the APCP and its committees during my first year in the role of Chair, and as of April this year as one of the company directors, as the APCP became officially a Company Limited by Guarantee.

This year our conference "The Growing child" is being hosted here in the city of Manchester just in time for the Christmas lights to be switch on this evening I believe!!

For Manchester the worker Bee has long been a symbol of the city, harking back to the industrial revolution where Manchester's factories were known as Bee hives as the workers within them were so busy and productive. So the symbol of the Bee has inspired our conference hash tag this year #APCP2018Beethere.

This year has been quite a year of extreme weather for the national committee, a snow storm on the first weekend of March meant that our working weekend and national committee were reduced to half numbers as not everyone could safely travel to join us in Birmingham. My own journey I remember was quite dramatic and took over 2 hours to complete the 13 mile drive by car just across the city, so hats off to all of the committee members that were able to join us in their snow boots that weekend. We had a productive if shortened weekend none the less. A few of us from the exec committee traveling into the city centre to sign papers at the bank for the new company accounts, and the first Fellowship committee meeting reviewing fellowship nominations took place.

I am pleased to report our membership is still slowly growing now at 2400 members. I am also pleased to announce the launch of our latest guidance document "APCP Professional staff Development Programme- A Tool for developing B5 staff to B6 level. You will be able to hear all about this work from Allan tomorrow morning at 830am and this document is now available for download from the APCP website.

The roll out of the Cerebral Palsy integrated pathway or CPIPUK continues. You can hear from the CPIP programme tomorrow some of the stories from regions across England and Scotland and even abroad on how implementation of CPIP is being managed in our first CPIPUK study day

We are still currently member's elect of the IOPTP and will be given full membership in 2019 at the AGM in Geneva. Our joint APCP / IOPTP conference is in the early stages of

development and will be held in London in 2020. The conference to be titled "2020 vision" will be an international conference open to all country members of IOPTP. We are also in the midst of planning some exciting events for 2019 so please keep an eye out on social media and web site for more announcements in the coming weeks.

#### 6. Treasurer's report - Nicola Burnett

The accounts for 2017 have been examined by the accountants; Nicklins Business Advisors. There was surplus of approximately £22,000 for the national accounts. A summary of the accounts was included in the last newsletter.

Our main income is from subscriptions and national conference and courses and a small amount is from the annual capitation fee from the CSP. Our biggest expenses continue to be committee travel, course and conference expenses and the cost of administrators. The profit in 2017 was largely due to decreased conference and course expenses and we have saved over £12,500 on printing expenses now we have an online newsletter.

Each year we allocate £10,000 to award as bursaries but we only spent a small proportion of this money in 2017 due to the very few applications we have received. If you are thinking of starting some research then please do apply for one of our research bursaries. We have now put aside some of this money to fund some online training packages and we hope to have more information available soon.

We currently get an annual capitation fee from the CSP and in 2017 we received £4734.00. The CSP have decided to change the way that money is distributed to the professional networks and in the future each network will have to apply for funding for a specific project or piece of work, the amounts will be £3000 or £5000. This is in order to allow some of the smaller groups to apply for larger amounts because the capitation fee is obviously based on the number of members in each network and favours the larger networks.

If you were at conference last year you will remember that a vote was passed in favour of the APCP becoming a non-profit making company limited by Guarantee. This was done on the advice of our accountants and following consultations with the CSP and other independent advisors and was due to our high annual turnover and the members being vulnerable to financial risk if we continued as an Unincorporated Organisation.

We had a slight delay in our application to become an incorporated company, as we had to seek *permission to use the name Association of Paediatric Chartered Physiotherapists* from both the CSP and HCPC. We were granted permission to form a registered company on the 8<sup>th</sup> February 2018 and we have adjusted our accounting year to start from the 1st April 2018.

The period from 1st January 2018 to 31st March 2018 needs to be accounted for and the accounts for this period have been submitted to the accountants.

On the advice of our accountants we have now centralized all of the regional accounts into the main APCP account. This will make banking for the regions more straightforward – no difficulties with local banks about changes of signatories and all income and payments will be made for each region through Fiona. Each region will get a quarterly update on their finances and will be able to continue to use their funds to finance local projects or bursaries as decided by the local committee.

I am due to step down at Treasurer at the end of the year but I have agreed to carry on until we have completed our first year as a Company at the end of March 2019. If you are interested in taking over as treasurer or have any other questions then please do contact me.

#### 11. Honorary memberships:

Michelle announced the honorary membership, which was awarded to Professor Eleanor Main. Michelle made the following speech:

You will have heard her speaking this morning Eleanor is an internationally recognised leader in physiotherapy research and education within the Specialist clinical areas - paediatric cardiorespiratory and Neuro-development.

Originally from South Africa Eleanor was a Clinician at GOSH from early 1990's – 2007 she completed her Masters in Research Methods in Kings College London in 1995 and went on to complete her PhD at UCL 2001- Paediatric Cardiorespiratory Physiology.

Eleanor is already a Fellow of the CSP and become the first ever Chair (Professor) of Physiotherapy at University College London 2016. Eleanor has obtained over £1.7 million pounds of research funding, over 120 peer reviewed journal articles and is the Editor of the text book 'cardiorespiratory physiotherapy' 5th edition. She has made a hug contribution to the education of Paediatric Physiotherapists with the UCL MSc/PG Diploma/PG Cert set up in London.

Her work colleagues describe her as *intelligent, innovative, determined, kind and compassionate human being and a Superstar!* 

So she encompasses everything that the APCP stands for and we would like to recognise her accomplishments and contributions to Paediatric Physiotherapy with this honorary membership.
