The main areas of NICE's work are


Producing evidence-based guidance and advice

Providing a range of information services


Evidence-based guidance and advice & Quality Standards

From the home page, you can select 'view all Guidance' or search by different criteria like 'conditions and diseases':



Under 'Get Involved' you can see what opportunities there are to be involved by seeing which consultations are open for comments (comment on a consultation), see opportunities to join a committee developing guidance, or find out about events open to the public such as being able to observe a committee meeting (come to an event).

To find out more about a specific guidance topic, if you click on View all Guidance, you will see this page



There are options to **search for guidance** in different stages:

- Published
- In consultation
- In development
- Awaiting development


And you can use **specific filters** to narrow your search: date range; type; area of interest; guidance programme.

Exploring published guidance on a topic:

For a full guidance topic, like Cystic Fibrosis, the main webpage includes a helpful interactive flowchart on the left with links to different areas, and a menu on the right with different sections: 'about' the topic; 'resources', 'Information for the public' and 'quality standards'.



Rapid guidelines (produced when there is an immediate need for guidance, so often briefer): For example: "COVID-19 rapid guideline: cystic fibrosis" last updated in October 2020. The page looks like this:



You can look at an overview on the

'Guidance' page with links to the different sections of the guidance on the left and there is a link to download the full guidance document.


At the 'Evidence' page where you can find all the references to the evidence on which the guidance was based

And at the 'Tools and resources' which includes advice on implementing the guidance.


Exploring a specific guidance topic which is under development:

For example, suppose your search took you to the page for 'Rehabilitation for chronic neurological disorders including acquired brain injury'

The page consists of 2 sections: Project Information (where in the stage the guidance has reached)



Project documents (all the documentation in the development of the guidance and the completed guidance if it has been published).




You can then click on any document to view it. If the guidance is in a consultation period, all the consultation documents are here.

Here you can search their online journals, the Cochrane Library etc. or log in to OpenAthens which includes options for PubMed, Ovid online and other searches and more online journals.

If you instead select **Evidence search**, you can currently search for all the evidence on a topic, to help you make better, faster evidence-based decisions. It includes high quality resources from over 800 organisations. However this service is closing in March 2022 and it is not yet clear whether there will be a replacement.
